

Sermon Discussion Guide

April 10, 2022

READ

Read 1 Corinthians 16 aloud and consider making some observations about the passage.

Sermon Recap: Review the sermon with your group, highlighting the following:

- Pastor J.D. reviewed the book of 1 Corinthians like this: Divisions in the church (chapters 1–4), questions about sex and singleness (chapters 5–7), controversies in the church (chapters 8–10), worship wars (chapters 11–14), resurrection (chapter 15), and the conclusion (chapter 16).
- Who should give? Each one. When? Regularly. Where? To the needs of the saints.
- Four ways God leads us: his Word, his church, his Spirit through prayer, and circumstances.
- Five commands that could sum up Paul's teaching in 1 Corinthians: be alert, stand firm in the faith, be courageous, be strong, and do everything in love.

1. As we finish this series on 1 Corinthians, which parts of the book did God use in your life the most? How?
2. Where do you regularly look for guidance in making decisions? (Self? Google?) What are some practical ways we can become more attentive to how God is leading us?
3. Out of the five commands from the sermon, which one is hardest for you to pursue and why? How can we encourage one another to fight for obedience?
4. What is one tangible way you can practice generosity towards someone in need this week?
