# SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE / OCTOBER 1

# TO APPLY-NOT REHASH-THE SERMON

#### Read

Read Jonah 1 and consider making some observations about the passage.

### **Sermon Recap**

Review the sermon with your group, highlighting the following:

- "The story of Jonah is not about a great fish, but about a great and merciful God, who invites his children to be extensions of his mercy to others."
- Sin is the intentional decision to go away from God (Jonah 1:3, 10).
- Becoming an "extension of mercy" means we have the right identity—rooted in Christ (Jonah 1:4–10).
- Becoming an "extension of mercy" means we need community with those we don't like (Jonah 1:11–16).

## **Group Discussion**

- 1. What did you know about the Jonah story before this weekend? How did the way Pastor Bryan framed the book's theme change your approach to the story?
- 2. In Jonah's story, it is easy to see sin as a decision to "go away from God," because he literally got on a boat! Our sin is usually more subtle. How have you seen sin in your life manifest as a decision to run from God?
- 3. What identities do you choose for yourself—ethnic, cultural, socioeconomic, career, relational? What might it look like, practically, to make these identities secondary to your identity in Christ?
- 4. What groups of people do you avoid or spend little time with? How can you, like Jonah, move toward community with them?
